The name of Lankford and G.A.M.T.R.A are almost synonymous. When one reviews the history of G.A.M.T.R.A and its incorporation in 1989. the Lankford name pops up every where. To begin with, two Lankfords, Bill and H.C. were the founding members. Later on, H.C. served as president of the group. While Bill and H.C. were always active, their father, H. C. Lankford Sr. was overseeing all our activities. Hub, as we knew him, would bring his lawn chair over and place it strategically so that he could see all that was going on.

Early on, the whole family; mother, father, brothers and sisters got involved by preparing the dinners that we serve to our exhibitors during the Cotton Ginning Days Show. The family continued to do this for several years until the Bessemer City Lions club took over. Bill was the primary chef in the preparation of the food.

Both Bill and H.C. were greatly involved in the building of the Wilson Engine Building and the Lankford Gin building. It should be noted the Mr. and Mrs. H.C. Lankford Sr. purchased the gin and press machinery that are now in the gin building. After the death of Mr. Lankford Sr., Mrs. Lankford, Sr. continues to contribute funds to G.A.M.T.R.A.

Over the years, Bill's activities have been curtailed, although he continues to display his Sterling Cycle engine at our Cotton Ginning Days show. H.C. was very active in club and work activities until his death.
